## IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-ONE

AN ACT Amending Section Twelve of Chapter Thirty-six of the Revised Statutes, Relating to the Sale of Clams, Oysters and Scallops.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Paragraph eight of sub-division five of section twelve of 2 chapter thirty-six of the revised statutes, being the sub-

- 3 division commencing with the words "in case of food", is
- 4 hereby amended by striking out the words "a food shall not
- 5 be" in the third line of said paragraph and inserting in place
- 6 thereof the words 'no food except clams, oysters and
- 7 scallops shall be', so that said paragraph, as amended, shall
- 8 read as follows:

'Sect. 2. Eighth: If it does not conform to the standards 2 of strength, quality and purity, now or hereafter to be es-3 tablished by statute or fixed by the commissioner of agricul-4 ture: provided, that no food except clams, oysters and 5 scallops shall be deemed to be adulterated under this pro-6 vision if the standard of strength, quality or purity be plain-7 ly stated, so as to be understood by the non-professional 8 person, upon the container thereof, although the standard 9 may differ from that established by statute or fixed by said 10 commissioner.'
