RESOLVE, Appropriating Money to Pay the Claim of Roswell S. Cushing Against the State of Maine.

---

Resolved: That there be paid to Roswell S. Cushing of  
2 Lynn, Mass., the sum of three hundred and forty-seven  
3 dollars and forty-two cents for injuries sustained by him-  
4 self and wife and damage to his Cadillac car, October elev-  
5 enth, nineteen hundred and nineteen, near Dunstan in the  
6 town of Scarborough, on the state highway, caused by a col-  
7 lision with a motor truck then and there being operated  
8 by an employee of the Maine state highway commission.

## STATEMENT OF FACTS

Mr. Cushing was proceeding toward Portland, October 11, 1919, keeping on the right side of the road. The truck owned by the highway commission, No. XI-640 and being driven by Roland Wood of Augusta, was coming toward Mr. Cushing and on the same side of the road.

When Mr. Cushing perceived that a collision was inevitable, he stopped his car and was run into by the truck almost head on. As a result of the collision, the Cadillac car was badly injured and Mr. Cushing was obliged to spend \$77.95 in order to put the car in condition to drive to his home.

Mr. Cushing's wife, who was in the car at the time with him, was thrown against the side of the car and sustained injuries which made it necessary to have an X-ray examination made and pay for several visits by a doctor.

In addition to the sums actually expended by Mr. Cushing, he is advised that to put his car in its original condition it will be necessary to replace the front axle, one mud guard, a right and left spindle arm, a tie rod and a wind shield, all of which with the cost of labor will amount as he is advised to the sum of \$259.47, making a total of \$347.42.
