**IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND
NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-ONE**

AN ACT to Amend Section Fifteen, of Chapter Nine, of the Revised Statutes, and Section Thirty-two, of Chapter One Hundred Seventeen, of the Revised Statutes, Relating to the Board of State Assessors.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Section fifteen, of chapter nine, of the revised
2 statutes, as amended by chapter one hundred ninety-five, of
3 the public laws of nineteen hundred and nineteen, is hereby
4 amended by striking out the word "necessary" in the third
5 line thereof, the words "at expense not exceeding two thou-
6 sand eight hundred dollars a year," and by adding to said
7 section the words 'within the appropriation for that pur-

pose;’ so that as amended said section shall read as follows :

‘Sect. 15. They shall be provided with suitable rooms in the state house and may employ assistance in addition to a chief clerk as they shall deem necessary within the appropriation for that purpose.’

Sect. 2. Section thirty-two, of chapter one hundred seventeen of the revised statutes, as amended by chapter one hundred eighty-three of the public laws of nineteen hundred and seventeen, is hereby further amended by striking out the lines as far as the word “they” and inserting in place thereof the words ‘The annual salary of each member of the state board of assessors shall be, for the chairman twenty-five hundred dollars, and for each other member two thousand dollars. They shall also receive their actual expenses incurred in the performance of their official duties;’ also by striking out the following words after the word “duties”: “The clerk of the board of state assessors shall receive an annual salary of fifteen hundred dollars,” and by inserting in place thereof the words, ‘They shall employ a chief clerk and such other clerical assistance as may be necessary. The chief clerk in the office of the board of state assessors shall receive an annual salary of twenty-five hundred dollars and he shall also receive his actual expenses incurred in the performance of his official duties;’ so that said section as amended shall read as follows :

‘Sect. 32. The annual salary of each member of the state board of assessors shall be, for the chairman twenty-five hundred dollars, and for each member two thousand dol-

4 lars. They shall also receive their actual expenses incurred
5 in the performance of their official duties. They shall em-
6 ploy a chief clerk and such other clerical assistance as may
7 be necessary. The chief clerk in the office of the board of
8 state assessors shall receive an annual salary of twenty-
9 five hundred dollars and he shall also receive his actual
10 expenses incurred in the performance of his official duties.'
