STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-ONE

AN ACT Amending Chapter Thirty-eight of the Public Laws of Nineteen Hundred and Nineteen, Relating to the Retiring and Pensioning of Employees of the State of Maine.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:
That all of sections one and two of chapter thirty-eight of
2 the public laws of nineteen hundred and nineteen be struck
3 out, and the following sections be substituted in place there4 of.

'Section 1. The superintendent and board of trustees of 2 any state institution and the head of any state department 3 shall recommend the retirement from active service and

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4 the placing upon a pension roll, any employee who shall 5 have attained the age of seventy years, who makes appli-6 cation therefor, who has been employed in any state in-7 stitution or department of this state, with a good record for 8 the term of twenty-five years, or more, and such employee, 9 subject to the approval of the governor and council shall be 10 so retired and pensioned.

Sect. 2. Any employee who is retired, as provided in 2 this act, shall be allowed one-half the average wage or sal-3 ary he or she was receiving for the five years previous to 4 the time of such retirement.'
