STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-ONE

AN ACT to Amend Section Ten of Chapter One Hundred Twenty-eight of the Revised Statutes Relating to the Unauthorized Use of Insignia of War Veterans.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section ten of chapter one hundred twenty-eight of the
2 revised statutes is hereby amended, so that said section as
3 amended shall read as follows:

'Whoever wilfully wears the badge, button or other in2 signia of the Grand Army of the Republic, of the Sons of
3 Veterans, of the United Spanish War Veterans, or of the
4 American Legion, or the official discharge button of the
5 army, navy or marine corps, or uses or wears the same to
6 obtain aid or assistance thereby within the state, unless he
7 shall be entitled to use or wear the same under the rules

8 and regulations respectively of the Department of Maine of 9 the Grand Army of the Republic, of the Sons of Veterans, 10 of the United Spanish War Veterans, or of the American II Legion, or under the regulations of the army, navy or 12 marine corps, shall be punished by imprisonment for not 13 more than thirty days, or by fine not exceeding twenty dol-14 lars, or by both such fine and imprisonment.'
