STATE OF MAINE

**IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND
NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-ONE**

AN ACT to Increase the Salaries of the Clerks of Courts of Androscoggin, Franklin, Hancock, Kennebec, Knox, Lincoln, Penobscot, Washington and York Counties.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section forty of chapter one hundred and seventeen of 2 the revised statutes is hereby amended by striking out all 3 of said section, and inserting in place thereof the following:

'Sect. 40. The clerks of the judicial courts in the several 2 counties shall receive annual salaries from the treasurer of 3 the counties in monthly payments paid on the last day of 4 each month as follows:

Androscoggin, twenty-two hundred dollars.

Aroostook, two thousand dollars.

Cumberland, twenty-five hundred dollars; deputy clerk of
2 courts, eighteen hundred dollars.

Franklin, sixteen hundred dollars.

Hancock, twenty-one hundred dollars.

Kennebec, twenty-five hundred dollars.

Knox, fifteen hundred dollars.

Lincoln, twelve hundred dollars.

Oxford, sixteen hundred dollars.

Penobscot, twenty-five hundred dollars.

Piscataquis, twelve hundred dollars.

Sagadahoc, seventeen hundred dollars.

Somerset, eighteen hundred dollars.

Waldo, twelve hundred dollars.

Washington, two thousand dollars, beginning with the first
2 day of January, nineteen hundred and twenty-one.

York, two thousand dollars.

The sums above mentioned shall be in full compensation
2 for the performance of all duties required of clerks, in-
3 cluding those performed by them as clerks of the supreme
4 judicial court, superior and county commissioners' courts,
5 or by clerks pro tempore employed by them, and the sum
6 provided for the clerk in Lincoln county shall be in full for
7 all such services and also in full for services as clerk of
8 Lincoln municipal court. They shall account quarterly un-
9 der oath to the county treasurers for all fees received by
10 them or payable to them by virtue of the office, except fees

11 collected by them in naturalization proceedings under the
12 act of congress of June twenty-fifth, nineteen hundred and
13 ten, specifying the items, and shall pay the whole amount
14 of the same to the treasurers of their respective counties
15 quarterly on the first days of January, April, July and Octo-
16 ber of each year.'
