STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-ONE

AN ACT to Amend Sections One and Three of Chapter One Hundred Sixteen of the Revised Statutes, Relating to Duties Payable by Public Officers.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows: Section I. Section one of chapter one hundred sixteen of the revised statutes is hereby amended by striking out the word "treasurer" in the last line of said section and substituting in place thereof the word 'secretary'; so that said section, as amended, shall read as follows:

'Section 1. No person appointed to the office of justice 2 of the peace, trial justice, notary public, coroner, inspector 3 of fish, assayer of ores and metals, commissioner to take

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4 depositions and disclosures, disclosure commissioner, com-5 missioner appointed under section twenty-four of chapter 6 seventy-eight, and no woman appointed to administer oaths 7 and take acknowledgments of deeds, shall enter upon the 8 discharge of his or her official duties until he or she has 9 paid five dollars to the secretary of state.'

Sect. 2. Section three of chapter one hundred sixteen of 2 the revised statutes is hereby amended by striking out the 3 word "treasurer" in the second line of said section and sub-4 stituting in place thereof the word 'secretary', so that said 5 section, as amended, shall read as follows:

'Sect. 3. Every person licensed as a private detective 2 shall, before receiving his license, pay to the secretary of 3 state ten dollars.'
