## STATE OF MAINE

## IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-ONE

AN ACT to Provide for the Filling of Vacancies in the Office of United States Senator by Appointment, and to Amend Section Forty-two of Chapter Seven of the Revised Statutes Relating Thereto.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows: Section 1. Whenever a vacancy occurs in the representa-2 tion of the state in the Senate of the United States by rea-3 son of death or resignation, or from any other cause, such 4 vacancy shall be filled at the next general election, provided 5 the vacancy occurs not less than sixty days prior thereto; 6 otherwise, at the general election following. If the Senate 7 is in session when such vacancy occurs, or should a session

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8 thereof be called before the next general election, the gov-9 ernor may appoint some suitable person to be senator until 10 his successor shall be elected and qualified.

Sect. 2. Section forty-two of chapter seven of the revised 2 statutes is hereby amended by striking out in the second 3 line thereof the words "in the Senate of the United States 4 or"; so that said section, as amended, shall read as follows:

'Sect. 42. Whenever a vacancy occurs in the representa-2 tion of the state in the national house of representatives, 3 the governor, in any manner having knowledge thereof, 4 shall issue his proclamation for an election to fill the same. 5 If congress is in session when such vacancy occurs, the 6 proclamation shall issue forthwith; otherwise, in season to 7 secure representation at the next called or regular session 8 of congress.'

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
