STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND
NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-ONE

AN ACT to Amend Subdivision VII of Section Sixty-four,
Chapter Eighty-six of the Revised Statutes, Relating to
Property Exempt from Attachment and Execution.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Amend subdivision VII of section sixty-four, chapter
2 eighty-six of the revised statutes by striking out the words
3 "three hundred" in the second and fifth lines of said sub-
4 division VII and the word "twenty" in the eighth line of
5 said subdivision and substituting therefor the words 'five
6 hundred' and 'forty' respectively, so that said subdivision
7 VII shall read as follows:

'VII. One pair of working cattle, or instead thereof one
2 pair of mules or one or two horses not exceeding in value

3 five hundred dollars, and a sufficient quantity of hay to
4 keep them through the winter season. If he has more than
5 one pair of working cattle or mules, or if the two horses
6 exceed in value five hundred dollars, he may elect which
7 pair of cattle or mules or which horse shall be exempt. If
8 he has a pair of mules or one or two horses so exempt, he
9 may also have exempt for each of said horses or mules,
10 one harness not exceeding forty dollars in value; and one
11 horse sled not exceeding the same value; but if he has at
12 the same time an ox sled, he may elect which sled shall be
13 exempt.'
