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RESOLVE, in Favor of Mary S. Hillman.

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Resolved: That there be and hereby is appropriated the  
2 sum of three hundred dollars (\$300) per annum for the  
3 years nineteen hundred and twenty-one and nineteen hun-  
4 dred and twenty-two, the said money to be paid Mary S.  
5 Hillman, of Island Falls, in quarterly payments of seventy-  
6 five dollars (\$75) each.



## STATEMENT OF FACTS

Said Mary S. Hillman is the widow of Harold C. Hillman, who was deputy sheriff for the county of Aroostook, and who, it is believed, was killed at said Island Falls by reason of his diligence and faithfulness in enforcing the prohibitory law of this state, while in the performance of his official duties. Said Mary S. Hillman has a family of six children and has a small amount of property for her support and the maintenance of her family.
