STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-ONE

AN ACT to Amend Section One Hundred Forty-six of Chapter Sixteen of the Revised Statutes as Amended Relating to the Appropriation for Maintenance of Normal and Training Schools.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section one hundred forty-six of chapter sixteen of the

2 revised statutes as amended by chapter sixty-four of the 3 public laws of nineteen hundred seventeen and by chapter 4 one hundred forty-nine of the public laws of nineteen hundred to the state of the public laws of nineteen hundred forty-nine of nineteen hundred forty-nine of nineteen hundred

5 dred nineteen is hereby further amended by striking out

6 the words "one hundred twenty-seven thousand dollars" in

7 the third line thereof and substituting the words 'seventy-

8 five thousand dollars for the period ending June thirtieth,

9 nineteen hundred twenty-one, and thereafter one hundred 10 eighty thousand dollars' in place thereof, so that said section 11 as amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 146. For the support of the five normal schools 2 and Madawaska Training School, the sum of seventy-five 3 thousand dollars for the period ending June thirtieth, nine-4 teen hundred twenty-one, and thereafter one hundred eighty 5 thousand dollars is annually appropriated, to be expended 6 under the direction of said trustees, which sum the treas-7 urer of state shall deduct for said purpose from any school 8 money raised for the support of common schools. The gov-9 ernor and council may from time to time, as they think 10 proper, draw warrants therefor and said treasurer in favor 11 of said trustees.'
