STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND
NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-ONE

AN ACT to Amend Section Thirty-seven of Chapter Twenty-
four of the Revised Statutes Relating to the Appropriation
for the Abolishment of Grade Crossings.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section thirty-seven of chapter twenty-four of the revised
2 statutes is hereby amended by adding after the word "year"
3 in the second line thereof the words 'except as herein pro-
4 vided,' and by adding at the end of said section the follow-
5 ing paragraph: 'The amounts to be appropriated under the
6 provisions of this section shall be cumulative and any part
7 of said sum of ten thousand dollars not expended during

8 the year for which it is appropriated shall, at the close of
9 said year, be added to the sums subsequently appropriated,
10 and may be expended in any subsequent year or years'; so
11 that said section as amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 37. Amount to be paid by state limited. The amount
2 to be paid under the provisions of the three preceding sec-
3 tions by the state in any one year, except as herein provided,
4 shall not exceed ten thousand dollars, and said sum shall
5 be annually appropriated. The amounts to be appropriated
6 under the provisions of this section shall be cumulative and
7 any part of said sum of ten thousand dollars not expended
8 during the year for which it is appropriated shall, at the
9 close of said year, be added to the sums subsequently appro-
10 priated, and may be expended in any subsequent year or
11 years.'
