STATE OF MAINE

**IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND
NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-ONE**

AN ACT to Repeal the Act Incorporating the Town of Concord and Providing for the Organization of the Same into a Plantation, to be Known as Concord Plantation.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. So much of the act entitled, "An Act to incorporate the town of Concord," passed January twenty-five, eighteen hundred and twenty-one, being chapter twenty-two of the private and special laws of Maine, as was not affected by an act entitled, "An Act to set off a part of the town of Concord and annex the same to Pleasant Ridge plantation," approved February nine, eighteen hundred and eighty-six, being chapter three hundred and eighty of the private and special laws of Maine, is hereby repealed; pro-

10 vided, however, that the corporate existence, powers, duties
11 and liabilities of said town shall survive in so far as may
12 be necessary for the purposes of prosecuting and defend-
13 ing all pending actions and causes of actions to which said
14 town of Concord is or may become a party and for the
15 service of any process arising from such actions or causes
16 of actions; and for the further purposes of settlement of
17 all claims and demands and the satisfaction of any judg-
18 ment which may be recovered in favor of or against said
19 town of Concord.

Sect. 2. The territory comprised within the limits of the
2 said town of Concord, as now constituted, is hereby organ-
3 ized into a plantation to be known as Concord Plantation,
4 and said plantation is hereby authorized to take and hold
5 all properties and all the assets and to assume all the lia-
6 bilities of said town of Concord; and for the accomplish-
7 ment of the purposes of this section said plantation, through
8 its treasurer, is further authorized to issue, under the super-
9 vision of the commissioners of the county of Somerset and
10 with such restrictions as the law may require, its corporate
11 notes or bonds to enable it to liquidate forthwith such lia-
12 bilities as it may be compelled to assume in complying with
13 the provisions of this act.

Sect. 3. This act shall not take effect until it shall have
2 been accepted by a majority vote of the legal voters within
3 said town of Concord at its annual meeting to be held in
4 March, nineteen hundred and twenty-two. The result in

5 said town of Concord shall be declared by the selectmen
6 and a due certificate thereof filed by the town or plantation
7 clerk with the secretary of state within thirty days from
8 the date of said town meeting.
