STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-ONE

AN ACT to Annex a Certain Gore of Land to the Town of Westfield.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

All of a certain gore of land, in the county of Aroostook 2 hereinafter described is hereby annexed to the town of 3 Westfield in said county of Aroostook. Commencing at 4 the southwest corner of the present town of Westfield, 5 thence westerly along the north line of E Plantation to the 6 east line of township ten, range three; thence, northerly, 7 along the east line of said township ten, range three, to the 8 southwest corner of the town of Presque Isle; thence, east-9 erly, along the south line of the town of Presque Isle to the 10 west line of the town of Westfield as now existing; thence, 11 southerly, along the present west line of the town of West-12 field to the place of commencing.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

The present town of Westfield is bounded on the south by Plantation E and on the north by the town of Presque Isle. The west line of Plantation E and the town of Presque Isle is about one-half mile west of the west line of Westfield. The east line of the town west of the town of Westfield is about onehalf mile west of the west line of Westfield. This leaves the gore of land described above. It was always supposed that this gore of land was a part of the town of Westfield until the old surveys were examined. At present and for several years parties owning land in gore pay taxes in town of Westfield.
