# IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-ONE

AN ACT to Amend Section Thirty-six of Chapter One Hundred and Four of the Revised Statutes Relating to Admission to Bail.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section thirty-six of chapter one hundred and four of the

- 2 revised statutes is hereby amended by striking out the words
- 3 "on criminal process" in the first and second lines thereof
- 4 and by inserting after the word "bailable" in the second line
- 5 thereof the word 'criminal', so that said section as amended
- 6 shall read as follows:

'Sect. 36. Any person under arrest for a bailable criminal 2 offense, may, before commitment to jail, if he so requests,

3 be taken by the officer having him in charge, before such 4 commissioner, who may inquire into the case and admit him

5 to bail. And any person arrested on the Lord's Day, or

6 on the afternoon or evening preceding, for a bailable of-

7 fense, may be admitted to bail on that day by such commis-

8 sioner.'
