STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND

RESOLVE, in Favor of Lena I. Sanborn, an Employee of
the Board of State Assessors in Nineteen Hundred and
Eighteen.

Resolved: That there be paid to Mrs. Lena I. Sanborn
2 seventy-five dollars and ninety-six cents (\$75.96), the
3 amount of the bonus due her as an employee of the state.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

The above was employed in the office of the board of state assessors from February 4, 1918, to November 16, 1918, and during 1918 a bonus was then paid state employees. Prior to that time she had worked in the state house since October, 1915, with the exception of a short period during the latter part of the year 1917. The bonus was recommended by the three members of the board of state assessors, and with the exception of the governor all were in favor of her receiving the bonus. The reason the governor gave was because she did not work until December 31, 1918. She was hired February 4, 1918, for an indefinite period, for the working out of a law created by the 1917 legislature, for which there was no appropriation made, namely, tax on personal property in unorganized townships. The governor and council appropriated eighteen hundred dollars (\$1800), of this amount about two-thirds was used for the working out of this law, and as her work was complete on November 16, 1918, that is the only reason she did not work until December 31, 1918.
