STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-ONE

RESOLVE, in Favor of Rena Cooley.

Resolved: That there be appropriated for the six months 2 ending June thirty, nineteen hundred and twenty-one, one 3 hundred dollars (\$100) and for the year from June thirty, 4 nineteen hundred and twenty-one, to June thirty, nineteen 5 hundred and twenty-two, the sum of two hundred dollars 6 (\$200) and for the year beginning June thirty, nineteen 7 hundred and twenty-two, and ending June thirty, nineteen 8 hundred and twenty-three, the sum of two hundred dollars 9 (\$200) to be paid in quarterly payments of fifty dollars 10 (\$50) each to Rena Cooley of Augusta, for and in behalf 11 of herself and her minor children, Violet and Evelyn Cooley, 12 under the supervision of the governor and council.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

The husband of Rena Cooley, while employed by the state, came to a violent death in the line of his duty, leaving a widow and two small children and the state has appropriated by resolve a similar sum for several years. The sum is not as large as would be accruing to the widow under compensation acts.
