STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-ONE

AN ACT to Amend the Charter of the City of Lewiston and to Provide for a City Auditor.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

2 be appointed by the mayor, he shall hold his office for a

Section 1. A city auditor for the city of Lewiston shall

- 3 term of four years from the date of his appointment. He
- 4 shall give to the treasurer of the city of Lewiston a bond,
- 5 for the faithful discharge of his duties, with sureties, or
- 6 with a surety company authorized to do business in the
- 7 state, as surety, to be approved by the mayor, with the ad-
- 8 vice and consent of the city council. Said bond shall not be
- 9 less than ten thousand nor more than fifteen thousand dol-

10 lars. He shall be a competent accountant. Vacancy oc-11 curring during a term shall be filled for the unexpired term.

Sect. 2. The city auditor shall examine all accounts and 2 demands against the city, including all matters requiring 3 the payment of money from the city treasury. In the ex-4 amination of claims, accounts and demands he may require 5 affidavits that articles have been furnished, services ren-6 dered, and expenses incurred as therein specified; and the 7 affidavits for articles furnished, services rendered, and ex-8 penses incurred, for or by any officer, institution, commis-9 sion, or board of trustees, may be made by the disbursing 10 agent or any officer thereof having special knowledge of II the matter. All accounts and demands against the city 12 shall be fully itemized and rendered in duplicate and filed 13 with the city auditor for his approval before payment. He 14 shall in all cases, after he has approved a claim, account 15 or demand, or any matter requiring the payment of money 16 from the treasury, make a certificate specifying the amount 17 due and allowed thereon, the name of the party to whom 18 such amount is due or payable and the particular head, ex-19 penditure, department or appropriation to which it is charge-20 able.

Sect. 3. The auditor shall keep on file in his department, 2 all original bills and vouchers on which moneys have been 3 or may be paid from the treasury. He shall also keep on 4 file all affidavits filed with him in relation to the auditing 5 of any matters before him. All boards, commissions, agents

6 or public officers authorized to make contracts under which 7 moneys may be payable from the city, shall at once file with 8 the auditor certified copies of any and all contracts made 9 by them.

The auditor shall keep a distinct account of all 2 city receipts and expenditures under appropriate heads. He 3 shall keep a statement of all property belonging to the city 4 and of all debts and obligations due to and from the city. 5 He shall investigate all accounts, demands, bills, vouchers 6 or claims against the city, including those made by any 7 city officer, agent, department, trustee, or commission. And 8 if, after said investigation, the amount demanded seems 9 to be excessive or improper, he may reject the account or to claim, in whole or in part, and if the person presenting II such account or claim is dissatisfied therewith, the auditor 12 shall report the same to the city council, with a separate 13 certificate therefor. He shall have free access to all the 14 books and papers of the several departments, commissions, 15 boards, or trustee of the city. Every officer, department, 16 commission or board of trustees shall keep books of ac-17 counts in such form and in such manner as the auditor 18 shall direct, and they shall at all times make such reports 19 to the auditor as he may require. He shall from time to 20 time, notify the said officers, agents, heads of departments, 21 commissions and trustees, who are entrusted with the ex-22 penditure of public moneys of the city, of the condition of 23 the specific appropriation which they are entrusted to ex-24 pend, showing the balance of such appropriation unexpended.

25 The auditor shall not approve nor issue his certificate for 26 the payment of any bill or account unless there is a specific 27 appropriation or fund for the payment thereof, or an ex-28 penditure is authorized by the city council to be paid out of 29 the contingent fund or otherwise authorized by law.

Sect. 5. The city auditor shall annually, between the first 2 day of February and the fifth day of March, examine the 3 books, accounts and vouchers of the city treasurer, and re-4 port the result of such examination to the city council. The 5 books, accounts, vouchers, affidavits and other records and 6 papers in his office relating to public business shall be open 7 for inspection to the citizens of said Lewiston at all reason-8 able times and for all proper purposes.

Sect. 6. He shall, on or before the first Monday of May, 2 of each year, submit to the city council a report, showing 3 a full and accurate statement of the financial condition of 4 the city and of the financial transactions thereof for the 5 preceding year, ending on the last day of each February. 6 Said report shall contain a statement of the receipts by, and 7 the payments from the city treasury, and a statement of the 8 receipts by, appropriations for, and expenditures of each 9 department, commission and board of trustees, for the pre-10 ceding year; the latter statement shall be so made that it 11 will show a separate statement in detail of each department 12 of the city, for said year. All salaries and other general 13 charges and appropriations shall likewise appear in said re-14 port.

Sect. 7. On or before the first Monday of April of each 2 year, the heads of the various departments, city institutions, 3 commissions and boards of trustees, who are entrusted with 4 the expenditure of public moneys, shall file with the auditor 5 a written estimate in detail of the necessary expenditures 6 of the department, institution or commission, of which they 7 are in charge, for the following year, together with the esti-8 mated income. This estimate shall be divided into, first, 9 fixed charges; second, other charges; third, extraordinary 10 or unusual expenses. A written statement showing the rea-II son for all estimated expenditures, other than fixed charges, 12 shall be filed with said estimate. Said auditor shall tabulate 13 these statements under the various heads, and annually on 14 or before the last Monday of April shall submit to the city 15 council a report showing these tabulated statements, includ-16 ing the reasons given for estimated expenditures, other than 17 fixed charges, together with an estimate of the ordinary 18 revenues of the city, and such other means as the city auditor 10 may be able to point out for defraying the expenses of the 20 city, so that said report shall show the estimated revenues 21 and income of the city, and the estimated expenditures of * 22 the city for the year following.

Sect. 8. No officer or agent of the city, or officer or mem-2 ber of any department thereof, whose duty it is to expend 3 money under an appropriation by the city council, shall con-4 tract any bill or incur any obligation on behalf of the city 5 in excess of the appropriation, or wages fixed by law, and 6 whoever exceeds in his expenditure said appropriation, shall 7 not have any claim for reimbursement. Any such officer or 8 agent of the city, or officer or member of any department 9 thereof, who shall knowingly or wilfully violate the provito sions of this section shall upon conviction be fined two huntil dred dollars, and imprisoned in the discretion of the court 12 for not less than three months.

Sect. 9. No member of a commission, trustee, heads of 2 department, agent or other person holding a place of trust 3 in the city, shall be pecuniarily interested directly or indi-4 rectly in any contracts made in behalf of the city, and any 5 violation hereof is void and shall not be approved by said 6 auditor; and if any such officer or person receives any draw-7 backs, presents, gratuities or secret discounts to his own 8 use on account of such contracts, or from the profits in any 9 materials, supplies or labor, furnished or done for the city, 10 he shall upon conviction be fined not less than two hundred 11 dollars, and imprisoned for not less than three months.

Sect. 10. The auditor shall receive an annual salary of 2 twenty-five hundred dollars. He may employ such assist-3 ance as may be necessary for the dispatch of public business. 4 He shall be furnished an office in the city building and all 5 expenses authorized under this act shall be paid by the said 6 city, including premium on said bond.

Sect. II. The auditor shall open an account with the col-2 lector of taxes, charging him with the whole amount of 3 taxes committed, also the supplementary tax and all interest 4 due; he shall also open an account with the treasurer, charg-5 ing him with the amount of loans and sums of money that 6 may be borrowed for the city, and all securities and sums 7 receivable, in order that the value and description of all 8 personal property belonging to the city may be seen at any 9 time in his books.

Sect. 12. The auditor shall keep on file in his office a list 2 of the current prices of supplies and materials used in the 3 several departments of the city.

Sect. 13. He shall, between the fifth and the tenth day of 2 each month, cause to be published in the newspapers of 3 said city, a report showing the receipts and expenditures 4 of each department for the preceding month.

Sect. 14. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent with this 2 act are hereby repealed.
