**IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND  
NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-ONE**

---

AN ACT to Amend Chapter Two Hundred and Ninety-four of  
the Laws of Nineteen Hundred and Seventeen, Relating to  
Seizure and Forfeiture of Vehicles Carrying Intoxicating  
Liquors Intended for Illegal Sale.

---

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Chapter two hundred and ninety-four of the public laws of  
2 nineteen hundred and seventeen are hereby amended by  
3 striking out all of said chapter after the period following  
4 the words, "intoxicating liquors," in the eleventh line of  
5 said chapter so that said chapter as amended shall read as  
6 follows:

'All automobiles, trucks, wagons, boats or vessels, and ve-  
2 hicles of every kind, not common carriers, containing in-

3 toxicating liquors intended for illegal sale within the state,  
4 found within the state in the possession or in the control of  
5 any person using them for the transportation of intoxicat-  
6 ing liquors intended for illegal sale within the state, shall be  
7 seized by any officer seizing the liquors transported therein,  
8 shall be libeled as is provided for the libeling of intoxicating  
9 liquors and the vessels in which they are contained under  
10 chapter one hundred and twenty-seven of the revised stat-  
11 utes, and shall be declared forfeited by the court and sold  
12 in the same manner as is provided for the sale of vessels  
13 containing intoxicating liquors.'
