## STATE OF MAINE

## IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-ONE

AN ACT to Make Uniform the Fees of the Deputy Sheriffs in Attendance Upon Supreme Judicial and Superior Courts.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Chapter one hundred and eighteen, section five of the re-2 vised statutes as amended by chapter two hundred and 3 twenty-two of the public laws of nineteen hundred and 4 nineteen and as further amended by chapter two hundred 5 and forty-four of the public laws of nineteen hundred and 6 nineteen is hereby amended by striking out all of the words 7 between the word "messenger" in the first line of the twenty-8 second paragraph and the word "while" in the fourth line of 9 said paragraph, and by striking out all of the words be-10 tween the word "day" in the sixth line of said paragraph

11 and the word "and" in the eighth line of said paragraph, so12 that the twenty-second paragraph as amended shall read as13 follows:

'Sect. 5. Every deputy sheriff and court messenger while 2 in attendance upon the supreme judicial court or the supe-3 rior court in their several counties shall receive for said at-4 tendance and service four dollars a day; and the sheriff, at 5 its opening, shall present to the court, a list of the officers 6 attending, with a statement of the duties of each; and the 7 court shall determine the number necessary, and disallow 8 charges for others.'
