## STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND  
NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-ONE

AN ACT to Amend Chapter Eighty-five, Section One, of the Private and Special Laws of Nineteen Hundred and Fifteen, as Amended by Section One, of Chapter One Hundred and Eighty-one, of the Private and Special Laws of Nineteen Hundred and Seventeen, Relating to a Better Protection of Lobsters Within Certain Waters Adjacent to Hancock County.

---

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section one of chapter eighty-five of the private and special laws of nineteen hundred and fifteen, as amended by section one, of chapter one hundred and eighty-one of the private and special laws of nineteen hundred and seventeen, is further amended by adding the following words after the words "Lopaus Point", in the sixth line, so that said section as amended shall read as follows:

‘Section 1. No person shall take, catch, kill or destroy  
2 any lobsters between the first day of July and the first day  
3 of September in each year in any of the waters of Hancock  
4 county between a line on the east, extending due north and  
5 south through Egg Rock Light in Frenchman’s Bay and a  
6 line on the west and south, beginning at the extreme south-  
7 western point of Mt. Desert Island known as Lopaus Point;  
8 thence in a northerly direction along the west side of Mt.  
9 Desert Island to the western point of High Head, thence  
10 in a westerly direction to the northern point of Bartlett’s  
11 Island, thence in a westerly direction to the southern point  
12 of Newberry Neck, thence in a northwesterly direction to  
13 southern end of Woods Point, thence in a southerly direc-  
14 tion to the north end of Long Island, thence along the east-  
15 erly side of said island to its southern point, thence in a  
16 southerly direction to the north end of Tinkers Island,  
17 thence along the east side of said island, to its eastern point,  
18 thence in a southerly direction and in a direct line to the  
19 western end of Little Gotts Island, thence in a due south-  
20 east course three nautical miles, thence due northeast to a  
21 line running due south through Egg Rock Light; and no  
22 person shall set a trap within said water for the purpose  
23 of taking, catching, killing or destroying any lobsters be-  
24 tween said dates, under a penalty of one dollar for each  
25 lobster so taken, caught, killed or destroyed and under a  
26 penalty of five dollars for each lobster trap so set for said  
27 purpose.’
