**IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND
NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-ONE**

RESOLVE, Apportioning the Senators Among the Several
Counties

Resolved: That for the eighty-first legislature and suc-
2 ceeding legislatures, to and including that of the year nine-
3 teen hundred and thirty-one, each county shall be entitled to
4 elect the number of senators herein provided in the manner
5 prescribed by the constitution.

The county of Androscoggin shall be entitled to elect three
2 senators.

The county of Aroostook shall be entitled to elect three
2 senators.

The county of Cumberland shall be entitled to elect four
2 senators.

The **county of Franklin** shall be entitled to elect two senators.

The county of Hancock shall be entitled to elect two senators.

The county of Kennebec shall be entitled to elect three senators.

The county of Knox shall be entitled to elect two senators.

The county of Lincoln shall be entitled to elect two senators.

The county of Oxford shall be entitled to elect two senators.

The county of Penobscot shall be entitled to elect three senators.

The county of Piscataquis shall be entitled to elect two senators.

The county of Sagadahoc shall be entitled to elect two senators.

The county of Somerset shall be entitled to elect two senators.

The county of Waldo shall be entitled to elect two senators.

The county of Washington shall be entitled to elect two senators.

The county of York shall be entitled to elect three senators.

This resolve shall take effect only in case of the adoption by the people of the proposed amendments to sections one, two, four and five of part two of article four of the con-

4 stitution, increasing the number of state senators and pro-
5 viding a fixed basis for their apportionment, to be submit-
6 ted to the people on the second Monday of September, nine-
7 teen hundred and twenty-one, under a resolve of this legis-
8 lature.
