STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-ONE

AN ACT to Amend Section One of Chapter One Hundred and Nine of the Private and Special Laws of Nineteen Hundred and Nineteen, Relating to the Salary of Judge of the Bath Municipal Court.

Section one of chapter one hundred and four of the pub-2 lic laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-nine, as amended 3 by chapter one hundred and nine of the private and special

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- 4 laws of nineteen hundred and nineteen is hereby amended
- 5 by striking out the words "fifteen hundred" in the tenth
- 6 line of said section and inserting in place thereof the words

7 'seventeen hundred and fifty,' so that said section, as 8 amended, shall read as follows:

'Section 1. A municipal court is hereby established in 2 and for the city of Bath and the towns of Woolwich, Ar-3 rowsic, Georgetown, Phippsburg and West Bath in the 4 county of Sagadahoc, which shall be called the Bath mu-5 nicipal court and have and use a seal on all original 6 processes, and shall consist of one judge who shall be 7 appointed, commissioned and qualified as provided by the 8 law and constitution of the state. Said judge shall be a o member of the bar of Sagadahoc county and shall reside 10 during his continuance in office in the city of Bath, and II who shall receive from said city an annual salary of sev-12 enteen hundred and fifty dollars per year, to be paid him 13 in quarterly payments. Said salary shall be in full for all 14 the fees and emoluments of the office; provided, however, 15 that he shall receive in addition to said salary the legal 16 fees for all copies of processes and certificates by him 17 made. The present judge shall continue in office until the 18 end of the term for which he was appointed. The said 10 judge shall enter, or cause to be entered on the docket of 20 said court all civil and criminal actions, with full minutes 21 of the proceedings in and disposition of the same, which 22 docket shall be at all times open to inspection, and he shall 23 perform all other duties required of similar tribunals in this 24 state.'
