STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-ONE

RESOLVE, in Favor of the Penobscot Tribe of Indians for the General Care, Maintenance and Education Thereof.

Whereas, the State of Maine holds in trust for the Penobscot Tribe of Indians a certain large sum of money, to wit: eighty-eight thousand and ninety-two dollars and forty-four cents, and,

Whereas, all the funds appropriated by the seventy-ninth legislature for the care, maintenance and relief of said tribe have been expended for the purposes and in the manner prescribed by law, and because of the lack of available funds said tribe may fall into distress and be deprived of proper food, shelter and clothing, and,

Whereas, by reason of the foregoing facts the appropriation called for by this resolve is immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety and in the opinion of this legislature constitutes an emergency as contemplated by the constitution, be it therefore

Resolved: That there be appropriated from the state 2 treasury to be expended under the direction of the gov-3 ernor and council by the agent of the Penobscot Tribe of 4 Indians, for the benefit of said tribe for the first six months 5 of nineteen hundred and twenty-one, and for each of the 6 fiscal years ending June thirtieth, nineteen hundred and 7 twenty-two and June thirtieth, nineteen hundred and twenty-8 three, as follows:
