RESOLVE, Making Appropriations for the Passamaquoddy
Tribe of Indians for the Half Year from January First,
Nineteen Hundred and Twenty-one, to June Thirtieth, Nineteen Hundred and Twenty-one, and the Years July First,
Nineteen Hundred and Twenty-one, to June Thirtieth, Nineteen Hundred and Twenty-three.

Whereas, the Stat: of Maine holds in trust for the Passamaquoddy tribe of Indians a certain large sum of money, to wit: one hundred nine thousand ninety-four dollars and fifty cents, and whereas all funds appropriated by the seventy-ninth legislature for the cure, maintenance and relief of said tribe have been expended for the purposes and in the manner prescribed by law, and because of the lack of available funds, said tribe may fall into distress and be deprived of proper food, shelter and clothing, and,

Whereas, by reason of the foregoing facts the appropriation called for in this resolve is immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, and in the opinion of this legislature constitutes an emergency as contemplated in the constitution, be it therefore

Resolved: That there be paid from the state treasury, 2 to be expended under the direction of the governor and 3 council, to the agent of the Passamaquoddy tribe of In-4 dians for the benefit of said tribe for the period from Jan-5 uary first, nineteen hundred and twenty-one, to June thir-6 tieth, nineteen hundred and twenty-three as follows:
