STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-ONE

AN ACT to Establish the Commission of Foreign and Domestic Commerce.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. The governor shall appoint five persons who

shall constitute a board to be known as the commission

on foreign and domestic commerce. The members of the

board first appointed shall hold office until the thirty-first

day of January, nineteen hundred and twenty-two, nineteen

hundred and twenty-three, nineteen hundred and twenty
four, nineteen hundred and twenty-five and nineteen hun
dred and twenty-six. The governor shall annually on or

before the fifteenth day of January, appoint one member

of said board whose term of office shall be five years. The

governor shall annually, on or before the first day of Feb-

12 ruary, designate a member of said board to be its chair13 man for the year beginning February first. The members
14 of the board shall serve without compensation. Subject
15 to the approval of the governor and council the board may
16 secure a proper office at some place in New England, and
17 may appoint a secretary and fix his compensation. The
18 board may also appoint such clerks and experts as it may
19 require, subject to the approval of the governor and council.

Sect. 2. The board shall take such measures as it may 2 deem suitable to develop and increase the foreign and do-3 mestic commerce of this state, and shall cooperate with 4 any similar public bodies or officials in any movement to 5 develop and increase such commerce. The board, on be-6 half of the state, may accept contributions, and subject to 7 the approval of the governor and council, may expend the 8 same and also such sums as may be appropriated by the 9 legislature, for the purpose of carrying out the provisions 10 of this act.

Sect. 3. This act shall take effect from passage.
