AN ACT to Amend Chapter Three Hundred and Nineteen, of the Public Laws of Nineteen Hundred and Fifteen, and Acts Amendatory Thereof, Providing for State and County Aid in the Construction of Highway Bridges.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

'Sect. 11. To meet the financial obligations of the state to 2 be incurred under the provisions of this act there shall be 3 appropriated seven hundred thousand dollars from the pro-4 ceeds of bridge bonds authorized and issued in nineteen 5 hundred and twenty-one, nineteen hundred and twenty-two 6 and nineteen hundred and twenty-three; meaning hereby 7 to constitute said amounts, together with any unexpended 8 balance remaining in the account set up by authority of 9 section three, of chapter two hundred and fifty-one, public 10 laws of nineteen hundred and nineteen, a continuous carry-11 ing account, and said sums are hereby appropriated to meet 12 expenses of new construction.'
