STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-ONE

AN ACT to Enable South Bristol to Construct a State Aid Road to Christmas Cove.

Whereas there extends from Damariscotta Village, through the towns of Damariscotta, Bristol and South Bristol, to Christmas Cove, a continuous road more than fifteen miles in length, and,

Whereas four-fifths of said road is in said town of South Bristol, and full advantage cannot therefore, be taken of the provisions of chapter one hundred and fifty-four of the laws of the State of Maine for the year nineteen hundred and seventeen, as might be if said road was more evenly divided between said three towns, Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

When said town of South Bristol in any years shall have 2 taken advantage of said act of nineteen hundred and seven-3 teen, in such manner as to obtain the maximum state appor-4 tionment that may be obtained thereunder, it may appropri-5 ate and raise for said road in addition thereto, a sum not ex-6 ceeding the amount which either or both said other towns 7 might appropriate under said act of nineteen hundred and 8 seventeen for said road if the same were in said other towns. 9 and which shall not have been appropriated by them there-10 for and for all such appropriations there shall be set apart II by the state, to be used on said road, the same amount as 12 would have been set apart if the combined appropriations of 13 either of said other towns and the appropriation of said 14 South Bristol, made on the account of such other town, had 15 been wholly made by such other town, and all said money 16 shall be expended upon said road under and in accordance 17 with said Act of nineteen hundred and seventeen, until said 18 road shall be fully completed as a State aid highway.
