STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-ONE

RESOLVE, in Favor of James H. Burgess of Bangor, Penobscot County, State of Maine for Civil Pension.

Resolved: That there be paid to James H. Burgess of 2 Bangor the sum of fifty dollars per month during the pleas-3 ure of the Legislature. Said sum to be paid out of the sum 4 appropriated for the retiring and pensioning of the em-5 ployees of the State.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Whereas, James H. Burgess of Bangor, county of Penobscot, State of Maine, served twenty-four consecutive years the State of Maine in the capacity as judge of probate for the county of Penobscot and

Whereas, the said James H. Burgess has retired from said office and is now at the age of seventy-five years and is in very serious physical condition and is seriously incapacitated because of said physical condition and

Whereas, a general act was referred to the judiciary committee and committee on salaries and fees and which act would have covered the case aforesaid but the said committees determined that no general act was needed to compass the deserving condition of this case, unanimously voted to report the aforesaid resolve in lieu of a general act.
