STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-THREE

AN ACT to Amend Chapter Fourteen of the Public Laws of Nineteen Hundred and Twenty-one, Prohibiting the Hunting of Deer in the Counties of Cumberland and York.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Chapter fourteen of the public laws of nineteen hundred

- 2 and twenty-one is hereby amended by striking out the words
- 3 "town of York" in the third line thereof and by inserting
- 4 in place thereof the words 'county of Cumberland or,' and
- 5 also by striking out the words "said town" in the fifth line
- 6 of said chapter and by inserting in place thereof the words

7 'in either of said counties,' so that said chapter as amended 8 shall read as follows:

'It shall be unlawful for any person, at any time, to hunt, 2 chase, catch, kill or destroy, any deer in the county of 3 Cumberland or in the county of York. It shall also be 4 unlawful for any person to have in possession at any time 5 any deer or part or parts thereof, taken in either of said 6 counties. Whoever violates any provision of this act shall 7 pay a fine of not less than fifty dollars, or more than one 8 hundred dollars, and costs for each offense.'
