STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-THREE

RESOLVE, Proposing an Amendment to the Constitution of the State of Maine Providing for the Election on the Tuesday Next After the First Monday in November Biennially of Governors, Senators, Representatives and Other Officers Now Required to be Elected on the Second Monday of September Biennially.

Resolved: That the following amendment to the consti-2 tution of the state be proposed for the action of the legal 3 voters of the state in the manner provided by the consti-4 tution, to wit:

ARTICLE II. Section four is hereby amended as fol-2 lows, namely, by striking out the words "second Monday

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3 of September," in the second, and tenth and eleventh lines 4 of said section, and inserting in lieu thereof the words 5 'Tuesday next after the first Monday in November.'

ARTICLE VI. Section seven is hereby amended by strik-2 ing out the words "second Monday of September" in the 3 third line thereof and inserting in lieu thereof the words 4 'on Tuesday next after the first Monday in November.'

ARTICLE IX. Section ten is hereby amended by strik-2 ing out the words "second Monday of September," in the 3 second and third lines, and inserting in lieu thereof the 4 words "Tuesday next after the first Monday in November," 5 and section twelve of said article is hereby amended by 6 striking out the words "second Monday in September," in 7 the ninth line, and inserting in lieu thereof the words "Tues-8 day next after the first Monday in November."

Resolved, That all the foregoing is proposed to be voted 2 on as one amendment and not as two or more several 3 amendments.

Resolved, That the aldermen of cities, the selectmen of 2 towns and the assessors of plantations in this state are here-3 by empowered and directed to notify the inhabitants of 4 their respective cities, towns and plantations in the manner 5 prescribed by law at the meeting in September on the year 6 one thousand nine hundred and ten to vote upon the amend-7 ment proposed in the foregoing resolutions, and the ques-8 tions shall be, "Shall the constitution be amended as pro-9 posed by a resolution of the legislature providing for the 10 holding of the election on the Tuesday next after the first 11 Monday in November biennially of governors, senators and 12 representatives and other officers now required to be elected 13 on the second Monday in September biennially?" and the 14 inhabitants of said cities, towns and plantations shall vote 15 by ballot on said questions, those favoring the amendment 16 voting "Yes" and those opposing it voting "No" upon their 17 ballots; and the ballots shall be received, sorted, counted and 18 declared in open ward, town and plantation meetings and 19 lists of the votes so received shall be made and returned 20 to the office of the secretary of state in the same manner 21 as votes for governor and members of the legislature, and 22 the governor and council shall count the same and make 23 return to the next legislature and if it shall appear that a 24 majority of the votes are in favor of the amendment, the 25 constitution shall be amended accordingly.

Resolved, That the secretary of state shall prepare and 2 furnish to the several cities, towns and plantations, ballots 3 and blanks for returns in conformity to the foregoing re-4 solves accompanied by a copy thereof.
