IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-THREE

AN ACT to Amend Section Nine of Chapter Forty of the Revised Statutes Relating to Unauthorized Advertisements as Certified Public Accountants.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section nine of chapter forty of the revised statutes is

hereby amended by striking out all of said section and sub
stituting therefor the following:

'Sect. 9. No person shall advertise or issue any sign, card 2 or other indication designating himself as a certified public 3 accountant or shall assume the title of a certified public 4 accountant or use the abbreviation of C. P. A. or any other 5 words, letters or figures to represent that he is a certified

6 public accountant or shall practice as such without having 7 received a certificate in accordance with the provisions of 8 the eight preceding sections of this chapter, or, having re-9 ceived such a certificate shall so advertise or represent him-10 self or practice after the revocation thereof. No partner-II ship, unless all of its partners are holders of a certificate 12 in accordance with the provisions of the eight preceding 13 sections of this chapter, and no corporation, shall use the 14 words "certified public accountant" in describing the part-15 nership or corporation or the business thereof; provided, 16 however, that any partnership or corporation may represent 17 that a specified person holding a certificate in accordance 18 with the provisions of the eight preceding sections of this 19 chapter is a member of such partnership or is in the service 20 or employ of such partnership or corporation. Any vio-21 lation of this section shall be punished by a fine of not 22 exceeding five hundred dollars.'
