IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-THREE

AN ACT to Amend Section Four of Chapter One Hundred
Twenty-nine of the Private and Special Laws of Nineteen
Hundred Seventeen, Entitled, "An Act to Amend the Charter of the York Beach Village Corporation."

Whereas, the York Beach Village Corporation is now heavily in debt, and whereas the said York Beach Village Corporation lacks sufficient funds to provide adequate police and fire protection for said York Beach Village Corporation, and whereas the said York Beach Village Corporation cannot provide adequate police and fire protection unless its revenue is increased by the immediate passage of this measure, and whereas by reason of the foregoing facts the immediate passage of this measure is necessary for the preservation of the

public peace, health and safety, and whereas the foregoing facts in the judgment of this legislature constitutes an emergency within the meaning of the constitution of this state, therefore

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Section four of chapter one hundred twenty-2 nine of the private and special laws of nineteen hundred 3 seventeen, is hereby amended by striking out the words 4 "fifty-five" in the tenth line thereof, and inserting in place 5 thereof the words 'seventy-five,' so that said section as 6 amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 4. On or before the first day of July annually, be-2 ginning in nineteen hundred seventeen, the town of York 3 shall appropriate and pay over to the York Beach Village 4 Corporation a sum of money computed as follows: From 5 the annual appropriation raised by the town taxation on 6 the estates and polls within said York Beach Village Cor-7 poration for the preceding year shall be deducted said cor-8 poration's proportional part, based on valuation and poll 9 tax assessment of the whole annual town levy for said pre-10 ceding year for state, county and school taxes, salary of II the town officers, reduction of town debt, interest on town 12 charges, appropriations for roads, poor, incidentals, and any 13 and all other town charges, and seventy-five per centum of 14 the sum thus determined, after deducting the corporation's 15 proportion of town obligations for hydrants and street 16 lights, shall be said sum to be annually paid over to said

17 corporation as herein provided. Said sum shall be ex18 pended by said corporation for its corporate purposes and
19 duties, and payment thereof to the corporation shall relieve
20 said town of all town charges within said corporation ex21 cept for street lighting, hydrant service, public schools, pub22 lic health, maintenance of poor, and such new construction
23 of drains and sewers as the town may vote to build, and
24 repair of town sewers. All the authority and duties of the
25 selectmen or road commissioner within said corporation shall
26 be exercised by said assessors; or they may appoint an agent
27 to perform the duties of road commissioner.'

Sect. 2. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble 2 hereof, this act shall take effect when approved.
