STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-THREE

AN ACT to Amend Paragraph Nine, of Section Six of Chapter Ten of the Revised Statutes, as Amended by Chapter 105, Public Laws of 1919, and by Chapter One Hundred and Nineteen, Public Laws of 1921, Relating to Taxation, and Repealing such Amendments.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Paragraph nine of section six of chapter ten of the revised
2 statutes, as amended by chapter one hundred five, public
3 laws of nineteen hundred nineteen, and by chapter one
4 hundred nineteen, public laws of nineteen hundred twenty-
5 one, is hereby further amended by repealing both of said
6 amendments so that said paragraph as amended shall read
7 as follows:

‘Paragraph IX. The polls and estate of persons who by
2 reason of age, infirmity or poverty, are in the judgment of
3 the assessors unable to contribute toward the public charges ;
4 and the polls of all soldiers and sailors who receive state
5 pension ; and the polls of all soldiers and sailors who served
6 in the army or navy of the United States in the war of
7 eighteen hundred and sixty-one and five, and were honor-
8 ably discharged from such service ; provided, however, that
9 any such soldier or sailor who desires to pay said tax may,
10 on or before the first day of April, in each year, notify in
11 writing the assessors of the city, town or plantation in
12 which he resides of his desire to pay said tax, whereupon
13 said assessors shall assess said tax against said soldier or
14 sailor, and said soldier or sailor shall be legally holden to
15 pay said tax.’
