STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-THREE

AN ACT to Amend Section Eleven of Chapter Nine of Public Laws of Nineteen Hundred and Nineteen, Relating to the Salary of the Stenographer of Penobscot County Superior Court.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:
Laws of 1919, c. 9, sec. 11; relating to salary of stenog2 rapher of Penobscot county superior court. Section eleven
3 of chapter nine of the public laws of nineteen hundred and
4 nineteen is hereby amended by striking out in the seventh
5 and eighth lines the words "eighteen hundred dollars an6 nually," and inserting in place thereof the words 'twenty-

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7 five hundred dollars annually,' so that said section, as amend-8 ed, shall read as follows:

'Sect. 11. Stenographer, salary and duties. The justice 2 of said court may appoint a stenographer to report the pro-3 ceedings thereof, who shall be an officer of the court and 4 be sworn to a faithful discharge of his duty and who shall 5 perform the duties prescribed and be subject to the pro-6 visions of the revised statutes, chapter eighty-seven, sections 7 one hundred and sixty-seven to one hundred and seventy-8 two, inclusive, so far as the same may be applicable. The 9 salary of said stenographer shall be twenty-five hundred 10 dollars annually, to be paid quarterly from the treasury of 11 the county.'
