STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to a Winter Speed Course or Way Above the Gardiner-Randolph Bridge at Farmingdale.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows: The Gardiner Driving and Agricultural Society is hereby
2 authorized to mark out and appropriate, yearly, a winter
3 speed course or way for horses and their drivers on the
4 Kennebec river at Farmingdale for a distance not exceed5 ing one mile northerly from the Gardiner-Randolph bridge,
6 and to charge a reasonable sum to each person who may
7 desire to attend races held thereon. Said course shall be
8 so located as not to abridge or impede a reasonable oppor9 tunity for public travel without the limits thereof, and not 10 to interfere with the use of the ice in said river for com-11 mercial purposes.
