# STATE OF MAINE

#### IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-THREE

AN ACT to Amend Paragraph Four of Section Six, Chapter Ten of the Revised Statutes of Maine, Relating to Exemptions from Taxation.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:
Paragraph four of section six, chapter ten of the revised
2 statutes is hereby amended by striking out the words "two
3 hundred" in the third line, and inserting in lieu thereof the
4 words 'five hundred,' and by striking out the word "fifty"
5 in the fourth line and inserting in lieu thereof the words
6 'one hundred,' so that the said paragraph four of said sec7 tion as amended shall read as follows:

'IV. The household furniture of each person, not in-

2 cluding five hundred dollars to any family, his wearing 3 apparel, farming utensils, mechanics' tools necessary for 4 his business, and music instruments not exceeding in value 5 one hundred dollars to one family.'
