RESOLVE, in Favor of Dr. Charles E. Johnson, of Princeton.

Resolved: That there be paid to Dr. Charles E. Johnson,
2 of Princeton, the sum of twenty-six dollars and ten cents,
3 the same being for medical services rendered in nineteen
4 hundred eighteen to George F. Ellsmore and wife, of Grand
5 Lake Stream Plantation.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

George F. Ellsmore, a native of East Machias, enlisted from that town in Co. "F," Fourteenth Maine Volunteer Infantry, on February 22, 1865, and was honorably discharged and mustered out of that regiment, August 28, 1865. He and his wife resided in Grand Lake Stream Plantation and were taken ill and both deceased in 1918.

The bill for medical attention for Mr. Ellsmore was for two special calls by Dr. Johnson, at \$8.00 each, and medicines amounting to \$2.95. The bill for Mrs. Ellsmore was for four calls at \$1.50 each, same being made at times when Dr. Johnson was calling in that vicinity, and medicines amounting to \$1.15.

Grand Lake Stream Plantation had a population of 231 in 1920 and a valuation of \$132,021.00 in 1923.
