IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-THREE

AN ACT to Amend Section Nineteen of Chapter Thirty-seven
of the Revised Statutes.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section nineteen of chapter thirty-seven of the revised
2 statutes is hereby amended by adding to said section the
3 following: 'All cans or other receptacles, used in the trans-
4 portation of ice cream, sherbert or frozen milk products,
5 shall be washed and cleansed before being returned and
6 forwarded to the producer or distributor of such ice cream,
7 sherbert or frozen milk products for use,' so that said
8 section, as amended, shall read as follows:

'Sect. 19. All cans or other receptacles, used in the

2 transportation of milk or cream, shall be cleansed and steril-
3 ized before being forwarded to the producer or distributor
4 of milk or cream for use. All cans or other receptacles,
5 used in the transportation of ice cream, sherbet or frozen
6 milk products, shall be washed and cleansed before being
7 returned and forwarded to the producer or distributor of
8 such ice cream, sherbet or frozen milk products for use.
9 Whoever by himself, clerk, servant or agent ships or trans-
10 ports or causes to be shipped or transported any cans or
11 other receptacles not cleansed and sterilized as provided in
12 this section shall be punished by a fine not exceeding fifty
13 dollars for each offense.
