IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE  
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-THREE

AN ACT to Amend Section Ten of Chapter One Hundred and Twenty-nine of the Revised Statutes, Relating to Dams, Canals, Mill Machinery, Ponds, Engines and Electrical Fixtures; Obstruction of Bridges and Ways.

---

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section ten of chapter one hundred and twenty-nine of  
2 the revised statutes is hereby amended by inserting after the  
3 word "reservoir" in the second line thereof the words 'fish-  
4 way, fish screen,' so that said section, when amended, shall  
5 read as follows:

'Sect. 10. Whoever wilfully or maliciously injures, re-  
2 moves or destroys any dam, reservoir, fishway, fish screen,

3 canal, trench or their appurtenances, or the gear or machin-  
4 ery of a mill or manufactory; draws off the water from a  
5 mill pond, canal or trench; destroys or injures any engine  
6 or its apparatus for the extinguishment of fire, or any posts,  
7 glass caps, wires or other material used in the construction  
8 and operation of a telegraph, telephone, electric light or  
9 electric power line; removes, injures or destroys any public  
10 or toll bridge, or places any obstruction on such bridge or  
11 on any public road, with intent to injure persons or property  
12 passing thereon, shall be punished by imprisonment for not  
13 more than three years or by fine not exceeding five hundred  
14 dollars.'
