**IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-THREE**

AN ACT to Amend Section Seventy-six of Chapter Sixteen of the Revised Statutes Relating to Inspection of Secondary Schools.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section seventy-six of chapter sixteen of the revised statutes is hereby amended by striking out the words "and for this purpose he shall be authorized to expend not to exceed four thousand dollars annually, which sum shall be paid from the state appropriation for the support of high schools," so that the section shall read as follows:

'All schools of secondary grade receiving state aid shall be inspected under the direction of the state superintendent

3 of public schools, and he shall determine what schools are
4 included in the classification of section seventy-three, what
5 schools maintain the courses of study, what schools are
6 entitled to state aid and what schools maintain approved
7 courses for the reception of tuition scholars.
