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STATE OF MAINE

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IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE  
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-THREE

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AN ACT to Amend Section Fifty-two of Chapter One Hun-  
dred Seventeen of the Revised Statutes as Amended by  
Chapter Thirty-four of the Public Laws of Nineteen Hun-  
dred Nineteen, Relating to the Board of Osteopathic  
Examination and Registration.

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Section fifty-two of chapter one hundred  
2 seventeen of the revised statutes, as amended by chapter  
3 thirty-four of the public laws of nineteen hundred nineteen,  
4 is hereby further amended by inserting and enacting after  
5 the words "dental examiners" in the second line, the words

6 'board of osteopathic examination and registration,' so that  
7 said section, as amended, shall read as follows:

'Sect. 52. The members of the board of dental examiners,  
2 board of osteopathic examination and registration, com-  
3 missioners of pharmacy, veterinary examiners, board of  
4 accountancy, library commission, and the examiners of  
5 applicants for admission to the bar shall each receive as  
6 compensation for their services five dollars a day, for the  
7 time actually spent, and their necessary expenses incurred in  
8 the discharge of their duties, to be certified by the secre-  
9 taries of their respective boards.'

Sect. 2. All acts or parts of acts inconsistent with the  
2 provisions of this act are hereby repealed or modified so  
3 as to conform to the provisions of this act.
