## STATE OF MAINE

### IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-THREE

AN ACT to Amend Section Fifty-two of Chapter One Hundred Seventeen of the Revised Statutes as Amended by Chapter Thirty-four of the Public Laws of Nineteen Hundred Nineteen, Relating to the Board of Osteopathic Examination and Registration.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:
Section 1. Section fifty-two of chapter one hundred
2 seventeen of the revised statutes, as amended by chapter
3 thirty-four of the public laws of nineteen hundred nineteen,
4 is hereby further amended by inserting and enacting after
5 the words "dental examiners" in the second line, the words

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6 'board of osteopathic examination and registration,' so that 7 said section, as amended, shall read as follows:

'Sect. 52. The members of the board of dental examiners, 2 board of osteopathic examination and registration, com-3 missioners of pharmacy, veterinary examiners, board of 4 accountancy, library commission, and the examiners of 5 applicants for admission to the bar shall each receive as 6 compensation for their services five dollars a day, for the 7 time actually spent, and their necessary expenses incurred in 8 the discharge of their duties, to be certified by the secre-9 taries of their respective boards.'

Sect. 2. All acts or parts of acts inconsistent with the 2 provisions of this act are hereby repealed or modified so 3 as to conform to the provisions of this act.
