STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-THREE

AN ACT to Amend Chapter One Hundred Thirty-six of the
Public Laws of Nineteen Hundred Twenty-one, Relating to
Night Fishing in Certain Waters of Kennebec County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section one of chapter one hundred and thirty-six of the
2 public laws of nineteen hundred and twenty-one is hereby
3 amended by striking out in the third line thereof the words
4 "six o'clock" and inserting thereof the word 'sunrise,' so
5 that said section as amended shall read as follows:

'Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to fish
2 for, take, catch or kill any kind of fish at any time between
3 eight o'clock in the afternoon and sunrise of the following

4 morning, in Purgatory pond or in Sand pond or in Buker
5 pond or in Jimmie pond, said ponds being the Tacoma chain
6 of lakes, so-called, situated in the town of Litchfield, and
7 in the town of Monmouth, or in Cobbosseecontee stream
8 from Collins' dam on said stream to Pleasant pond, in the
9 town of West Gardiner, all of said waters being situated
10 in the county of Kennebec. It shall also be unlawful for
11 any person to have in possession at any time any kind of
12 fish taken in violation of any provision of this section.'
