STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-THREE

AN ACT Providing for Full Time Service of State Officials.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. The attorney general, the secretary of state,
2 the treasurer of state, the state auditor, the insurance com-
3 missioner, the bank commissioner, the state superintendent
4 of public schools, the commissioner of health, the commis-
5 sioner of agriculture, the commissioner of labor and indus-
6 try, the commissioner of inland fisheries and game, the li-
7 brarian of the state library, the land agent and forest com-
8 missioner, the director of sea and shore fisheries, the adju-
9 tant general, the superintendent of public buildings, the
10 warden of the state prison, the superintendents of the vari-

11 ous state institutions, the members of the public utilities
12 commission, the members of the board of state assessors
13 and the members of the industrial accident commission,
14 shall devote their entire time to the duties of their respective
15 offices.

Sect. 2. The offices of the attorney general, the state au-
2 ditor, the bank commissioner, the commissioner of agricul-
3 ture, the commissioner of inland fisheries and game, the
4 librarian of the state library, the land agent and forest com-
5 missioner, the adjutant general, the superintendent of pub-
6 lic buildings, the board of state assessors and the industrial
7 accident commission, shall be at the capital. Their traveling
8 and other expenses shall be allowed them only when absent
9 from the capital on official business.

Sect. 3. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent herewith
2 are hereby repealed.
