IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-THREE

AN ACT to Amend Section Seven of Chapter One Hundred and Forty of the Revised Statutes, Relating to Accounts of Agents Appointed to Receive Fugitives from Justice.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section seven of chapter one hundred and forty of the re
vised statutes is hereby amended by striking out all of said

section and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

'Sect. 7. Governor may appoint an agent to demand fugi-2 tives in other states. R. S. c 139, # 7. In any case, author-3 ized by the constitution and laws of the United States, the 4 governor may appoint an agent to demand and receive of

5 the executive authority of any other state, any fugitive from

- 6 justice charged with any crime in this state, and the ac-
- 7 counts of such agent shall be audited by the county com-
- 8 missioner and paid from the treasury of the county in which
- 9 the crime is charged.'
