**IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-THREE**

AN ACT to Amend Section Eleven of Chapter Two Hundred and Eleven of the Private and Special Laws of Eighteen Hundred and Ninety-five as Amended by Chapter One Hundred and One of the Private and Special Laws of Nineteen Hundred and Nine as Amended by Chapter One Hundred and Forty-six of the Private and Special Laws of Nineteen Hundred and Fifteen as Amended by Chapter Thirty-three of the Private and Special Laws of 1919 Relating to the Salary of the Recorder of the Bangor Municipal Court.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section eleven of chapter two hundred and eleven of the 2 private and special laws of eighteen hundred ninety-five

3 as amended by chapter one hundred one of the private and
4 special laws of nineteen hundred nine, as amended by chap-
5 ter one hundred forty-six of the private and special laws of
6 nineteen hundred fifteen as amended by chapter thirty-three
7 of the private and special laws of nineteen hundred nineteen,
8 is further amended by striking out the words “fifteen
9 hundred” in the eighth line and inserting in place thereof
10 the words ‘seventeen hundred and fifty,’ so that said section
11 as amended shall read as follows:

‘Sect. 11. Said court shall be held at such places as the
2 city of Bangor shall provide and said city shall have power
3 and it shall be its duty to raise money and provide a proper
4 place for said court and its officers and suitably furnish,
5 warm and light the same, for which there shall be paid
6 from the county of Penobscot as rental in quarterly pay-
7 ments, the sum of one thousand dollars annually. The
8 salaries of the judge and clerk thereof which are hereby
9 fixed at eighteen hundred dollars and seventeen hundred
10 and fifty dollars respectively to be paid quarterly, with all
11 other expenses of said court, shall be paid from the treasury
12 of the county of Penobscot and in addition thereof there
13 shall be provided the sum of seven hundred and fifty
14 dollars a year for clerk hire, to be paid monthly from said
15 treasury, provided however, that the county commissioners
16 of said county may in their discretion, expend a larger
17 amount, not exceeding five hundred dollars per year, for
18 the employment of extra clerks.’
