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**STATE OF MAINE**

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IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE  
HUNDRED AND TWENTY-THREE

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RESOLVE, in Favor of the Board of Registration of Medicine.

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Resolved: That there be and hereby is appropriated to the  
2 board of registration of medicine to aid in defraying the  
3 expenses of said board for the year ending June 30, 1924,  
4 five hundred dollars; and for the year ending June 30,  
5 1925, five hundred dollars.

## STATEMENT OF FACTS

The board of registration of medicine is provided for in chapter eighteen of the revised statutes, sections nine to seventeen inclusive. It consists of six members of the medical profession and is charged with the duty of registering physicians and surgeons, examining applicants and passing upon their qualifications, investigating complaints, et cetera. The board has no revenue except the fifteen dollar fee payable by applicants under section eleven of said chapter eighteen. This has been found inadequate to meet the expenses of the board, which last year had to be met from the contingent fund.
