STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND TWENTY-THREE

RESOLVE, in favor of Mary A. Grant for State Pension.

Resolved: That the sum of twelve dollars per month be 2 paid to Mary A. Grant, widow of Marshall A. Grant, civil 3 war, to be paid quarterly from the fund appropriated for 4 military pensions, beginning January first, nineteen hundred 5 and twenty-three, and continuing during the pleasure of the 6 legislature.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Mrs. Grant is 77 years old. She is the owner of a small farm from which there is little or no income, and does not possess any personal property. Her means are very limited. Farm rated on town books at three hundred dollars.
