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**RESOLVE**, in Favor of Mary E. Ames, of Stockton Springs,  
for State Pension.

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Resolved: That there be appropriated the sum of twelve  
2 dollars per month for a pension for Mary E. Ames, of  
3 Stockton Springs, said pension to be paid during the pleas-  
4 ure of the legislature.

## STATEMENT OF FACTS

Mary E. nee Carley Ames, now in her 84th year, was born in Prospect, Maine, November 2, 1839, the daughter of H. G. Carley, who served three years in the war of 1812.

Her brothers, Mark, Lyman and Daniel, served in the civil war as follows:

Mark Carley served in the navy three years, receiving an honorable discharge, going home a wreck, dying a short time later in Tolono, Ill.

Lyman Carley enlisted in the 1st Maine Heavy Artillery, was transferred to the 18th Maine and was killed in action at the battle of Petersburg, Va., June 18, 1864.

Daniel Carley enlisted in the 4th Maine Reg., Co. G, re-enlisted and served through the war, dying at Togus, Maine, September, 1918.

Georgiana Carley, a sister, who was not normal, was cared for by Mrs. Ames for many years during the latter part of her life, dying at her home a short time ago.

Mrs. Ames' husband, now in his 86th year, was born March 30, 1836. He is unable and has been for several years to care for himself on account of his feeble condition resultant upon his declining years.

Mrs. Ames and her husband both are now living in the family of their son, which consists of wife and three children.
